### PUT OUT INTO THE DEEP

Faith is not a thing of quantity that can be measured – ‘wish I had more’. Faith is an active, abiding interaction, a relationship of trust. The leap of faith takes confidence on both sides. In a successful marriage husband and wife have confidence in and trust each other. That’s faith. When such faith is broken we are deeply hurt. This is the faith the incarnation is about; confidence in action between two people. How Jesus would have been gladdened by Peter’s response to today’s Gospel, “We have worked hard all night and caught nothing, but if you say so, I will put out our nets!”

We, like Peter, are called to be people of faith- to recognise the confidence Jesus has in us and respond.

How do I as a Christ bearer, inspire people to grasp the confidence Jesus has in them, how do I inspire to make that leap of confidence, to enter into that creative relationship which is faith?

For you, whoever you are, that is the Christian’s question. We are called to mission, to be ‘fishers of men’ (people).

What is it that prevents you from “leaving everything” and following Jesus today? How are you being called, in the everyday events of your life? How can God’s gift of faith, already present in your heart, be shared and encouraged to grow and bear fruit?



One day as he was walking near the Lake of Gennesaret, Christ met some fishermen. “Come with me,” he said to them, “and I will make you fishers of men.” Then they left their nets and followed.

**First Reading: Isaiah 6:1-8**

In the year that King Uzziah died, I saw the Lord sitting on a throne, high and lofty; and the hem of his robe filled the temple. Seraphs were in attendance above him; each had six wings. And one called to another and said: "Holy, holy, holy is the Lord of hosts; the whole earth is full of his glory." The pivots on the thresholds shook at the voices of those who called, and the house filled with smoke. And I said: "Woe is me! I am lost, for I am a man of unclean lips, and I live among a people of unclean lips; yet my eyes have seen the King, the Lord of hosts!" Then one of the seraphs flew to me, holding a live coal that had been taken from the altar with a pair of tongs. The seraph touched my mouth with it and said: "Now that this has touched your lips, your guilt has departed and your sin is blotted out." Then I heard the voice of the Lord saying, "Whom shall I send, and who will go for us?" And I said, "Here am I; send me!" The Word of the Lord.

**Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 15:3-8, 11 (Short Version)**

My brothers and sisters, I handed on to you as of first importance what I in turn had received: that Christ died for our sins in accordance with the scriptures, and that he was buried, and that he was raised on the third day in accordance with the scriptures, and that he appeared to Cephas, then to the twelve. Then Christ appeared to more than five hundred brothers and sisters at one time, most of whom are still alive, though some have died. Then he appeared to James, then to all the apostles. Last of all, as to one untimely born, Christ appeared also to me. Whether then it was I or they, so we proclaim and so you have come to believe. The word of the Lord.

**Gospel: Luke 5:1-11**

While Jesus was standing beside the lake of Gennesaret, and the crowd was pressing in on him to hear the word of God, he saw two boats there at the shore of the lake; the fishermen had gone out of them and were washing their nets. Jesus got into one of the boats, the one belonging to Simon, and asked him to put out a little way from the shore. Then he sat down and taught the crowds from the boat. When he had finished speaking, he said to Simon, "Put out into the deep water and let down your nets for a catch." Simon answered, "Master, we have worked all night long but have caught nothing. Yet if you say so, I will let down the nets." When they had done this, they caught so many fish that their nets were beginning to break. So they signalled their partners in the other boat to come and help them. And they came and filled both boats, so that they began to sink. But when Simon Peter saw it, he fell down at Jesus' knees, saying, "Go away from me, Lord, for I am a sinful man!" For Simon Peter and all who were with him were amazed at the catch of fish that they had taken; and so also were James and John sons of Zebedee who were partners with Simon. Then Jesus said to Simon, "Do not be afraid; from now on you will be catching people" When they had brought their boats to shore they left everything and followed Jesus. The Gospel of the Lord.
