The Field of our Mission

The laity's field of evangelization is the complex area of human society, of politics, and economics; theirs are the worlds of culture, of sciences and arts; international life; mass media. Their spheres include other openings ready for evangelization; human love; the family; education of children, and of adolescents; the world of work; and suffering. All these will be put to serve God's Kingdom to the extent that the laity, inspired by the Gospel, become involved, and competent, in all they have to do, while conscious of their call to exercise their Christian powers, too often dead and buried.

Evangelii Nuntiandi 70

The Church is not truly established and does not fully live, nor is a perfect sign of Christ unless there is a genuine laity existing and working alongside the hierarchy. For the Gospel cannot become deeply rooted in the mentality, life and work of a people without the active presence of lay people. Therefore, from the foundation of a church very special care must be taken to form a mature Christian laity.



The lay faithful belong fully to both the people in God and civil society. They belong to the nation into which they were born, they begin to share in its cultural riches by their education, they are linked to its life by many social ties, they contribute to its progress by personal effort in their professions, they feel its problems to be their own and they try to solve them. They belong also to Christ because by faith and baptism they have been reborn in the Church, so that by newness of life and work by might belong to Christ (cf. 1 Cor. 15:23), in order that all things might be subjected to God in Christ and that God might be all in all (cf. 1 Cor. 15:28).
