St Canice, our patron whose feast we celebrate today, was a monk from Derry who is thought to have lived from 515 to 599. He started his religious life in Wales, studied in Rome before returning to Ireland to preach and establish monasteries. In the early Irish church he was the special patron of the faithful against storms at sea.



"The joys and hopes, the griefs and anxieties of the men [sic] of this age, especially those who are poor or in any way afflicted, these are the joys and hopes, the griefs and anxieties of the followers of Christ. Indeed, nothing genuinely human fails to raise an echo in their hearts. For theirs is a community composed of human beings. United in Christ, they are led by the Holy Spirit in their journey to the kingdom of their father and they have welcomed the news of salvation which is meant for everyone. That is why this community realises that it is truly linked with humanity and its history by the deepest of bonds."

May this ringing declaration continue to be the chant by which we here at St Canice's plot our course into the future; we have left the shore, there is no going back.
