
Experiencing the Beauty

The disciples respond to the gift of the Transfiguration by trying to capture the beauty they experienced. Beauty however is not possessed, it is a gift and as such must be given, not kept back. Jesus invites them to take up the journey again without fear, to descent the mountain towards ordinary life and to embark upon the great road that will bring the Son of Man to Jerusalem for him to fulfil his destiny.

The invitation is addressed also to us. We are invited to continue on our pilgrimage to the heavenly Jerusalem without fear, knowing that he is with us and that for this reason, life is beautiful and that it is beautiful to commit ourselves to the Kingdom. We are invited to welcome, announce and share with all the Beauty that saves.

If we wished to make this thought relevant for today, we would say that rediscovering the beauty of God means rediscovering the reasons for our faith when faced with the evil that devastates the earth, and the profound reasons for our commitment to serve all, for the glory of God.

Whoever experiences the Beauty which appeared on Tabor and rediscovers it in the mystery of Easter, whoever believes in the announcement of the Word of faith and allows themselves to be reconciled with the Father in the communion of the Church, discovers the beauty of an existence more profound than can be given by anything or anybody in the world.
