## The Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed

### November Remembering

November is associated in our Catholic tradition with remembrance of the dead. Bringing to mind deceased family and friends can be very painful, especially if the loss is recent. But our liturgical celebrations remind us to look 'both ways': true remembrance is not just looking back to the past but also looking ahead to the future in trust and hope.

Just as our loved ones shared in Christ's death in baptism, we believe they share in Christ's resurrection and enjoy eternal life in God's presence. So we pray for the deceased in November, a month which begins with the celebration of All Saints (Nov 1st) and All Souls (Nov 2nd) and culminates with the feast of Christ the King (Nov 25th).

At a time when morale in the Church is suffering for a number of reasons, the feast of All Saints serves to remind us that, while we may be a Church of sinners we are also a church of saints. 'Their glory fills us with joy, and their communion with us in your Church gives us inspiration and strength' (Preface).

In earlier times, large tablets or 'diptychs' were inscribed with the names of the dead who were remembered at Mass, with names read out during the liturgy. There is something poignant and personal, I believe, in writing down the names of our deceased loved ones and asking the community to remember them in prayer. So once again this November, the *Liber Defunctorum* (The Book of the Deceased) will be placed at the entrance to the church during Mass; you are welcome to write down the names of your deceased family and friends who you wish to be remembered. You may wish to place an offering in the 'Church restoration' offering box in the wall nearby.

Every celebration of Mass, of course, includes prayers for the dead. All Souls gives a special focus to the basic Christian instinct and traditional Catholic practice of remaining in Communion with those who have gone before us marked with the sign of faith.

On this mountain the Lord of hosts will make for all peoples a feast of rich food, a feast of well-aged wines, of rich food filled with marrow, of well-aged wines strained clear. And he will destroy on this mountain the shroud that is cast over all peoples, the sheet that is spread over all nations; he will swallow up death forever. Then the Lord God will wipe away the tears from all faces, and the disgrace of his people he will take away from all the earth, for the Lord has spoken. It will be said on that day, Lo, this is our God; we have waited for him, so that he might save us. This is the Lord for whom we have waited; let us be glad and rejoice in his salvation.

### Second Reading: Romans 5: 5-11

And hope does not disappoint us, because God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit that has been given to us. For while we were still weak, at the right time Christ died for the ungodly. Indeed, rarely will anyone die for a righteous person—though perhaps for a good person someone might actually dare to die. But God proves his love for us in that while we still were sinners Christ died for us. Much more surely then, now that we have been justified by his blood, will we be saved through him from the wrath of God. For if while we were enemies, we were reconciled to God through the death of his Son, much more surely, having been reconciled, will we be saved by his life. But more than that, we even boast in God through our Lord Jesus Christ, through whom we have now received reconciliation.



### **Communal Apostolic Discernment – An Ignatian gift – explained to us at St Canice's.**

On Sunday **9 November 2014**, noted theologian, scholar and teacher Sister Margaret Beirne RSC will conduct a Conversation with parishioners following the 10.30 Mass in the Parish Hall.

Sr Margaret's theme is "*communal apostolic discernment*", the process used by Ignatius and his small group in the 1530s to discern by prayer and systematic thought what God might be asking of each of them and the group.

Sr Margaret will argue that this Ignatian process was a great gift to the Church, sometimes undervalued and perhaps needed now more than ever.
