Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord

When the people heard about this miracle, they went out onto the streets, and as Christ was passing by they shouted out "Hosanna! Blessed is our King!" At the same moment the Pharisees and Archpriests were holding a meeting and plotting to kill Jesus.



Palm Sunday is one of the most dramatic feasts in the Liturgy of the Church. Have you ever been in a crowd when you were ashamed of your own conduct? Palm Sunday is the Feast of the crowd, who on one day call out "Hosanna to the Son of David" and a few days later shout "Crucify Him! Crucify Him!"

The same Christ walks through both crowds, accepters and rejecters, and He continues to walk throughout crowds, never distancing himself from us, even when we betray Him as we do when we betray our better selves. It is a calling of all Christians to be Christ in the crowds, moving always among them, praying always never to be led by them.
