Sunday of the Resurrection

“Be Not Afraid”

“Do not be afraid.”

It seems mere weeks ago that we heard the angel announce this to the shepherds, heralding goods news of great joy for all people.

Today, the empty tomb shines new light on that message, giving us a clearer understanding of why we are to be joyful people rather than people of fear.

We now see that the swaddling clothes of the Nativity have led to the linen wrappings lying abandoned in the tomb, that the wood of the humble manger points to the triumph of the empty cross.

And the essence of the Christmas angel’s message has been repeated and amplified by the two men in dazzling clothes who greet the women at the tomb early on Easter morning.

“Why do you look for the living among the dead?” the men ask. “He is not here, but has risen.”

The joy we feel at the coming of our saviour has been intensified in witnessing his very act of salvation.

In the coming days, we will watch the disciples change from people hidden in fear behind locked doors to witnesses who join in Mary Magdalene’s joyful proclamation, “I have seen the Lord.”

The empty tomb defeats all our sorrows and worries, our hardships and fears, filling us instead with the good news of great joy for all people. We too, have seen the Lord.

He is risen! Alleluia!

Opening Prayer

O God, who on this day, through your Only Begotten Son, have conquered death and unlocked for us the path to eternity, grant, we pray, that we who keep the solemnity of the Lord's Resurrection may, through the renewal brought by your Spirit, rise up in the light of life.

First Reading: Acts 10: 34, 37-43

Peter began to speak to those assembled in the house of Cornelius. "You know the message of God sent to the people of Israel, preaching peace by Jesus Christ - he is Lord of all. That message spread throughout Judea, beginning in Galilee after the baptism that John announced: how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and with power; how he went about doing good and healing all who were oppressed by the devil, for God was with him. "We are witnesses to all that he did both in Judea and in Jerusalem. They put him to death by hanging him on a tree; but God raised him on the third day and allowed him to appear, not to all the people but to us who were chosen by God as witnesses, and who ate and drank with him after he rose from the dead. "He commanded us to preach to the people and to testify that he is the one ordained by God as judge of the living and the dead. All the prophets testify about him that everyone who believes in him receives forgiveness of sins through his name."

If you have been raised with Christ, seek the things that are above, where Christ is, seated at the right hand of God. Set your minds on things that are above, not on things that are on earth, for you have died, and your life is hidden with Christ in God. When Christ who is your life is revealed, then you also will be revealed with him in glory.

Gospel Acclamation

Gospel: John 20: 1-9

Early on the first day of the week, while it was still dark, Mary Magdalene came to the tomb and saw that the stone had been removed from the tomb. So she ran and went to Simon Peter and the other disciple, the one whom Jesus loved, and said to them, "They have taken the Lord out of the tomb, and we do not know where they have laid him." Then Peter and the other disciple set out and went towards the tomb. The two were running together, but the other disciple outran Peter and reached the tomb first. He bent down to look in and saw the linen wrappings lying there, but he did not go in. Then Simon Peter came, following him, and went into the tomb. He saw the linen wrappings lying there, and the cloth that had been on Jesus' head, not lying with the linen wrappings but rolled up in a place by itself. Then the other disciple, who reached the tomb first, also went in, and he saw and believed; for as yet they did not understand the scripture, that he must rise from the dead.
