The Feast of St Canice

Into the Storm



St Canice, our patron whose feast we celebrate today, was a monk from Derry who is thought to have lived from 515 to 599. He started his religious life in Wales, studied in Rome before returning to Ireland to preach and establish monasteries. In the early Irish church he was the special patron of the faithful against storms at sea.

The barque of Peter is still very much in need of Canice's protection as it sails the stormy waters of the early 21st century. We here at St Canice, Elizabeth Bay know he is aboard with us, inspired too by the words of Vatican II's *Gaudium et Spes*, our parish charter:

"The joys and hopes, the griefs and anxieties of the men (sic) of this age, especially those who are poor or in any way afflicted, these are the joys and hopes, the griefs and anxieties of the followers of Christ. Indeed, nothing genuinely human fails to raise an echo in their hearts. For theirs is a community composed of human beings. United in Christ, they are led by the Holy spirit in their journey to the kingdom of their father and they have welcomed the news of salvation which is meant for everyone. That is why this community realises that it is truly linked with humanity and its history by the deepest of bonds."

May this ringing declaration continue to be the chart by which we here at St Canice's plot our course into the future; we have left the shore, there is no going back.

"And now, inhabitants of Jerusalem and people of Judah, judge between me and my vineyard. What more was there to do for my vineyard that I have not done in it? When I expected it to yield grapes, why did it yield wild grapes? "And now I will tell you what I will do to my vineyard. I will remove its hedge, and it shall be devoured; I will break down its wall, and it shall be trampled down. I will make it a waste; it shall not be pruned or hoed, and it shall be overgrown with briars and thorns; I will also command the clouds that they rain no rain upon it. For the vineyard of the Lord of hosts is the house of Israel, and the people of Judah are his pleasant planting; he expected justice, but saw bloodshed; righteousness, but heard a cry! Gospel: Matthew 21:33-43

Jesus said to the chief priests and the elders of the people: "Listen to another parable. There was a landowner who planted a vineyard, put a fence around it, dug a wine press in it, and built a watchtower. Then he leased it to tenants and went to another country. "When the harvest time had come, he sent his slaves to the tenants to collect his produce. But the tenants seized his slaves and beat one, killed another, and stoned another. Again he sent other slaves, more than the first; and they treated them in the same way. "Finally he sent his son to them, saying, 'They will respect my son.' But when the tenants saw the son, they said to themselves, 'This is the heir; come, let us kill him and get his inheritance.' So they seized him, threw him out of the vineyard, and killed him. "Now when the owner of the vineyard comes, what will he do to those tenants?" They said to him, "He will put those wretches to a miserable death, and lease the vineyard to other tenants who will give him the produce at the harvest time." Jesus said to them, "Have you never read in the scriptures: 'The stone that the builders rejected has become the cornerstone; this was the Lord's doing, and it is amazing in our eyes'? Therefore I tell you, the kingdom of God will be taken away from you and given to a people that produces the fruits of the kingdom." The Gospel of the Lord.
