A Culture of Peace

Last month marked the 50th anniversary of the release by Pope John XXIII of the encyclical *Pacem in Terris*, (*Peace on Earth*), his last will and testament to humankind. It was written to a world in the grip of the Cold War, different to our time in many ways but the letter still speaks powerfully in the Spirit of today's Gospel:

'May Christ enflame the desires of all people to break through the barriers which divide them, to strengthen the bonds of mutual love, to learn to understand one another and to pardon those who have done them wrong. Through this power and inspiration, may all people welcome each other into their hearts as brothers and sisters, and may the peace they long for ever flower and ever reign among them.'

Building a "culture of peace" means more than the absence of war or violence. Peace is a set of values, attitudes and ways of behaving which promotes mutual understanding and peaceful settlement of conflict; violence in word or action is not the only response to violence.

The Gospel is a call to pause and shift our focus - and our language. If we can create a place of peace by looking deeply into our own heart, perhaps we can transform and remove the terror and violence embedded there.

If we can create one day of peace by refraining in our own families and community, from the language of fear, blame, refusal and bullying, perhaps we can recover the language of dialogue and forgiveness.

The culture of peace we Christian peacemakers are called to foster is based on trust and respect for the other. For our efforts we are to be called 'children of God' - (Matt 5:9) - a noble title! *Father Chris SJ*

First Reading: Acts 15: 1-2. 22-29

Certain individuals came down from Judea and were teaching the brothers, "Unless you are circumcised according to the custom of Moses, you cannot be saved." And after Paul and Barnabas had no small dissension and debate with them, Paul and Barnabas and some of the others were appointed to go up to Jerusalem to discuss this question with the apostles and the elders. Then the Apostles and the elders, with the consent of the whole church, decided to choose men from among their members and to send them to Antioch with Paul and Barnabas. They sent Judas called Barsabbas, and Silas, leaders among the brothers, with the following letter: "The brothers, both the Apostles and the elders, to the believers of Gentile origin in Antioch and Syria and Cilicia, greetings. Since we have heard that certain persons who have gone out from us, though with no instructions from us, have said things to disturb you and have unsettled your minds, we have decided unanimously to choose representatives and send them to you, along with our beloved Barnabas and Paul, who have risked their lives for the sake of our Lord Jesus Christ. We have therefore sent Judas and Silas, who themselves will tell you the same things by word of mouth. "For it has seemed good to the Holy Spirit and to us to impose on you no further burden than these essentials: that you abstain from what has been sacrificed to idols and from blood and from what is strangled and from fornication. If you keep yourselves from these, you will do well. Farewell."

Second Reading: Revelation 21:10-14. 22-23

In the spirit the angel carried me away to a great, high mountain and showed me the holy city Jerusalem coming down out of heaven from God. It has the glory of God and a radiance like a very rare jewel, like jasper, clear as crystal. It has a great, high wall with twelve gates, and at the gates twelve angels, and on the gates are inscribed the names of the twelve tribes of the Israelites; on the east three gates, on the north three gates, on the south three gates, and on the west three gates. And the wall of the city has twelve foundations, and on them are the twelve names of the twelve Apostles of the Lamb. I saw no temple in the city; for its temple is the Lord God the Almighty and the Lamb. And the city has no need of sun or moon to shine on it, for the glory of God is its light, and its lamp is the Lamb.

I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled, and do not let them be afraid. "You heard me say to you, 'I am going away, and I am coming to you.' If you loved me, you would rejoice that I am going to the Father, because the Father is greater than I. And now I have told you this before it occurs, so that when it does occur, you may believe."
