Ignatius the Mystic

St Ignatius of Loyola, whose feast we celebrated on Wednesday, is often seen and spoken of as a soldier of Christ and his followers as being co-warriors in a disciplined army out for conquest.

It's true, Ignatius started life as a soldier and always displayed the martial qualities of discipline, flexibility and planning as the first Superior General of the Society of Jesus. But essentially he was a mystic and fruit of his mysticism is the Spiritual Exercises, his great gift to the Church and the world.

Ignatius the mystic encountered his God in visions, in the Eucharist, in tears, through all his senses, memory, imagination, mind and heart - his whole person. His legacy to us is his claim that we too can experience our God in this genuinely direct fashion, that this is a grace not simply reserved for an elite but offered to all Christians.

Ignatius reminds us that the risen Christ is ceaselessly at work ('like a labourer') in every nook and cranny, every created reality, in his universe. We are called to be co-labourers with Christ in loving, apostolic service, in a "mysticism of everyday life".

Ignatius invites us to enter silently into God's presence, to encounter God within our hearts. He reminds us of our constant need to discern God's will in the signs of our times and in our lives.

Nearly all Ignatius' letters end with a prayer like the following; may it be ours:

'So I finish, imploring God in his infinite goodness to grant us the fullness of his grace so that we can feel his most holy will and fulfil it completely.'

So if you have been raised with Christ, seek the things that are above, where Christ is, seated at the right hand of God. Set your minds on things that are above, not on things that are on earth, for you have died, and your life is hidden with Christ in God. When Christ who is your life is revealed, then you also will be revealed with him in glory. Put to death, therefore, whatever in you is earthly: fornication, impurity, passion, evil desire, and greed which is idolatry. Do not lie to one another; seeing that you have stripped off the old self with its practices and have clothed yourselves with the new self, which is being renewed in knowledge according to the image of its creator. In that renewal there is no longer Greek and Jew, circumcised and uncircumcised, barbarian, Scythian, slave and free; but Christ is all and in all!

And Jesus said to the crowd, "Take care! Be on your guard against all kinds of greed; for one's life does not consist in the abundance of possessions." Then he told them a

Then he said, "I will do this: I will pull down my barns and build larger ones, and there I will store all my grain and my goods. At the 10.30 am Mass today, we are celebrating the **Feast Day of St Ignatius**, founder of the Jesuits. After this special Liturgy, we invite you to linger for a short while and join fellow parishioners for Morning Tea.

St Ignatius of Loyola (1491 – 1556) was a Spanish knight from a local noble family, hermit, priest since 1537, and theologian, who founded the 'Society of Jesus' (Jesuits) and was its first Superior General. Ignatius emerged as a religious leader during the Counter-Reformation.

Loyola's devotion to the Catholic Church was characterized by absolute obedience to the Pope.

Ignatius founded the Society of Jesus after being wounded in battle and experiencing a religious conversion. He composed the 'Spiritual Exercises' to help others follow the teachings of Jesus Christ.

In 1534, Ignatius and six other young men, including St. Francis Xavier and Bl. Pierre Favre, gathered and professed vows of poverty, chastity, and later obedience, including a special vow of obedience to the Pope.
