All Saints & All Souls

This coming week we celebrate the feasts of All Saints (Nov 1) and All Souls (Nov 2).

On Nov 1st we recognise all the saints of heaven in a universal celebration, a festival of the triumphant church of the resurrection in the new and holy city of Jerusalem. The saints, in a way, are God's harvests; God has reaped the fruits of good sowing and gathered the mature faithful unto the eternal storehouse. November opens a season of the year when we are reminded of our mortality, the hope of eternal life, the gratitude we feel for God's gifts and the love we owe others.

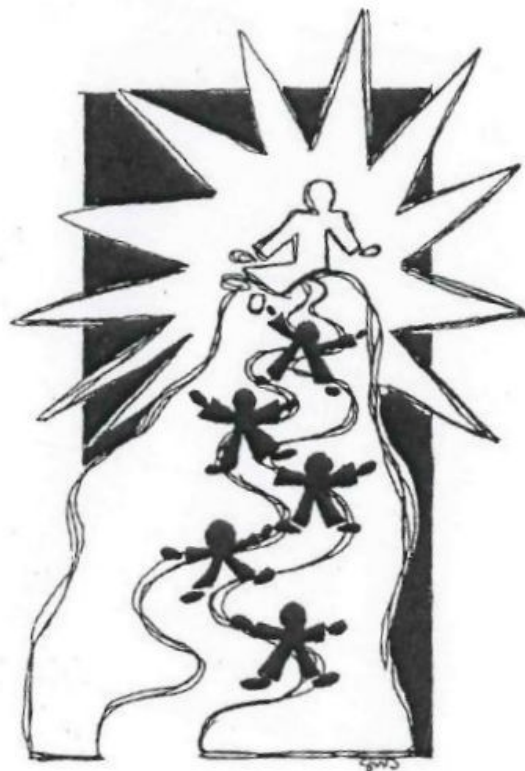
The Church honours many saints with a day of their own on the liturgical calendar, but there are many more saints than those, especially since Vatican II when the number of canonized men and women has considerably multiplied. We gather them all as one this day.

On Nov 2nd, All Souls Day, we remember the Faithful - Departed, those from the community who have died and await their entrance into glory, the dead who need forgiveness for their sins and yearn to see the face of God.

Both these feasts which honour the dead express our faith in the communion of saints and our need to pray for one another, especially those souls in purgatory "who have been buried in their human imperfection".

Again this November, the *Liber Defunctorum* (*The Book of the Dead*) will be open at the entrance to the church before each Mass; you are welcome to write down the names of family and friends whom you wish to be remembered. You may wish to place an offering in the 'Church Restoration' box in the wall nearby.
