## Twenty-Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time

### Social Justice Sunday

Today is Social Justice Sunday and our Australian bishops have published a statement '*A Crown for Australia: Striving for the best in our sporting Nation*', addressing the important role of sport in our society. (Copies at the back of church).

The Church has long recognised the value of sport as a binding, positive force, an agent for inclusion and recognition; as the bishops say "it provides a spectacular avenue for justice and peace".

But there are clouds beneath the silver lining; it can reflect the worst in us, showing us a side of society that is not only ugly but unjust as well. Along with community and spiritual benefits, the bishops warn of the dangers inherent in the increasing commercialisation of sport and the "win-at-all-costs" mentality that can produce abuses and exclusion.

The 'crown' of the Statement's title recalls St Paul writing to the Corinthians of an athlete's rigorous training in order to win "a wreath that will wither". The athlete's reward is a forerunner of the imperishable crown that we strive for in our spiritual lives.

A crown of glory is the prize for winners while for others "a crown of thorns can weigh heavily as it mocks and undermines the true worth of sport and its participants".

While sport brings us together, builds communities and lets us celebrate movement and skill, it is increasingly marked by violence and abuse of drugs and alcohol on and off the field as its commercial power is harnessed for private gain. It can become a megaphone for racism and sexism.

At its best, the bishops remind us, sport builds perseverance and resilience, encourages co-operation and hard work and teaches coping with success and failure, those twin imposters in every life. But when it loses sight of human good, we need to think hard about it; what do its failures tell us about ourselves as individuals and as a society? *Fr Chris.*

"When the righteous turn away from their righteousness and commit iniquity, they shall die for it; for the iniquity that they have committed they shall die. "Again, when the wicked turn away from the wickedness they have committed and do what is lawful and right, they shall save their life. Because they considered and turned away from all the transgressions that they had committed, they shall surely live; they shall not die."

**Second Reading: Philippians 2: 1-11**

If there is any encouragement in Christ, any consolation from love, any sharing in the Spirit, any compassion and sympathy, then make my joy complete: be of the same mind, having the same love, being in full accord and of one mind. Do nothing from selfish ambition or conceit, but in humility regard others as better than yourselves. Let each of you look not to your own interests, but to the interests of others. Let the same mind be in you that was in Christ Jesus, who, though he was in the form of God, did not regard equality with God as something to be exploited, but emptied himself, taking the form of a slave, being born in human likeness. And being found in human form, he humbled himself and became obedient to the point of death—even death on a cross. Therefore God highly exalted him and gave him the name that is above every name, so that at the name of Jesus every knee should bend, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

**Gospel: Matthew 21: 28-32**

When Jesus entered the temple, the chief priests and elders of the people came to him as he was teaching, and challenged his authority. So Jesus asked them this question. "What do you think? A man had two sons; he went to the first and said, 'Son, go and work in the vineyard today.' He answered, 'I will not'; but later he changed his mind and went. The father went to the second and said the same; and he answered, 'I am going, sir'; but he did not go. "Which of the two did the will of his father?" They said, "The first." Jesus said to them, "truly I tell you, the tax collectors and the prostitutes are going into the kingdom of God ahead of you. For John came to you in the way of righteousness and you did not believe him, but the tax collectors and the prostitutes believed him; and even after you saw it, you did not change your minds and believe him."

## Week of guided prayer 15<sup>th</sup> to 22<sup>nd</sup> October, 2014

We pray as a community in the Mass, and this gives us shape and sustenance in our lives. But praying alone, or 'desert prayer' as Sr Ruth Burrows likes to call it, is a solitary and very different experience, it can be harder and not as gratifying as receiving the sacraments. We can yearn to be close but find it difficult to get a regular routine and thus this solitary prayer is more easily forgotten. Yet our God calls us to be alone with Him in that private place within us, regularly as you would with any person in your life that you love.

St Ignatius desired for us all to find this intimacy with Christ, God and the Spirit, and this was the basis of the Spiritual Exercises. This week of guided prayer in daily life gives a taste of the Exercises, and the opportunity to meet each day with a prayer guide over the eight days. Each of us is different, and each of us will find ways of prayer that we find more helpful, that will 'fit'.

Put the week aside, come and see!

We will start as a group on Wednesday 15th October and conclude as a group on Wednesday 22nd October.

You will meet with your guide in the evenings of the weekdays, and in the later afternoons on the weekend.
