Relationship


For the Jewish people, God's covenant relationship was, and remains, pivotal. Other peoples in the ancient Middle East were left to wonder what kind of worship might placate their gods. Would even human sacrifice be sufficient? The Hebrews, by contrast, knew their God as a builder of sustainable, if stormy, relationships. Listening to God in the voices of the desert and in the events of their history, the Jewish people developed stories and prayer-forms designed to facilitate dialogue with the God with whom they were yoked. Prophetic voices summoned them back repeatedly to the demands of the covenant. They responded with protests and pleas, including many formalised in the psalms. The fortunes of God and of humankind were understood to be linked in powerfully mysterious ways, often easier sung than spoken. Ongoing dialogue between the people and their God was also designed to reduce the allure of illusion, addiction and enslavement to idols.

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 7: 32-35

I want you to be free from anxieties. The unmarried man is anxious about the affairs of the Lord, how to please the Lord; but the married man is anxious about the affairs of the world, how to please his wife, and his interests are divided. The unmarried woman and the virgin are anxious about the affairs of the Lord, so that they may be holy in body and spirit; but the married woman is anxious about the affairs of the world, how to please her husband. I say this for your own benefit, not to put any restraint upon you, but to promote good order and unhindered devotion to the Lord.

Gospel: Mark 1: 21-28

The disciples went to Capernaum; and when the sabbath came, Jesus entered the synagogue and taught. They were astounded at his teaching, for he taught them as one having authority, and not as the scribes. Just then there was in their synagogue a man with an unclean spirit, and he cried out, "What have you to do with us, Jesus of Nazareth? Have you come to destroy us? I know who you are, the Holy One of God." But Jesus rebuked him, saying, "Be silent, and come out of him!" And the unclean spirit, convulsing the man and crying with a loud voice, came out of him. They were all amazed, and they kept on asking one another, "What is this? A new teaching—with authority! He commands even the unclean spirits, and they obey him." 
1. Take, Lord, receive all my liberty,
