Sustaining Creation

World Environment Day (June 5) and the Pope's Encyclical *Laudato Si*, published last week remind us that the planet's health and vitality are decaying. During our own lifetime the human impact on the earth has increased enormously. Many of our natural resources have been destroyed and species have disappeared; climate change, flooding, drought, salination, deforestation, desertification, pollution, urban expansion and famine have all played their part. One billion people suffer from a shortage of fresh water and city slums grow on rubbish dumps. *The web of life seems of be unravelling.*

All of these issues of our world community seem to be interrelated. Exploitation and greed, the consequent poverty of human communities, displacement of people, environmental degradation all impact on each other. It is not possible to tackle one without confronting another. Certainly, these matters are political issues. They are economic issues. But at a deeper level, they are much more. At their core, they constitute a spiritual and moral crisis, touching all that we hold sacred.

We desperately need a change of spirit and attitude.

Development is not sustainable if it steals from present and future generations. Poverty and environmental crisis are interwoven; an appropriate response begins with sustainable values that recognise the interconnectedness of all life. Our faith can and should inform our actions and thinking about the created world, being a major force for change towards sustainable development, sustainable communities and a healthy environment.

We believe the life, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ has brought salvation not only to humankind, but also, in a different way, to the rest of creation. Respectful interdependence is a sign of the kingdom.

We are nourished and sustained in a special way as a community when we gather and celebrate the Lord with us in the Eucharist. The bread and the wine, fruit of the vine and the work of human hands, are God's gift to us, part of his creation and we offer them back to Him, blessed as the body and blood of His Son, Jesus the reconciler.

This weekend we are privileged to welcome among us the children of the parish sacramental programme who will be fully initiated into the Church through first Communion. They and their parents have been preparing for six weeks and today will receive the Body and Blood of Christ with the rest of the community for the first time.

We congratulate these children and their families and pledge our support as fellow pilgrims on the journey.

I do not mean that there should be relief for others and pressure on you, but it is a question of a fair balance between your present abundance and their need, so that their abundance may be for your need, in order that there may be a fair balance. Gospel: Mark 5:21-24, 35-43

When Jesus had crossed again in the boat to the other side, a great crowd gathered around him; and he was by the sea. Then one of the leaders of the synagogue named Jairus came and, when he saw him, fell at his feet and begged him repeatedly, "My little daughter is at the point of death. Come and lay your hands on her, so that she may be made well, and live." So he went with him. And a large crowd followed him and pressed in on him. While he was still speaking, some people came from the leader's house to say, "Your daughter is dead. Why trouble the teacher any further?" But overhearing what they said, Jesus said to the leader of the synagogue, "Do not fear, only believe." He allowed no one to follow him except Peter, James, and John, the brother of James. When they came to the house of the leader of the synagogue, he saw a commotion, people weeping and wailing loudly. When he had entered, he said to them, "Why do you make a commotion and weep? The child is not dead but sleeping." And they laughed at him. Then he put them all outside, and took the child's father and mother and those who were with him, and went in where the child was. He took her by the hand and said to her, "Talitha cum," which means, "Little girl, get up!" And immediately the girl got up and began to walk about (she was twelve years of age). At this they were overcome with amazement. He strictly ordered them that no one should know this, and told them to give her something to eat.
