Catholic Mission Sunday

Today is Catholic Mission Sunday. Catholic Mission is the Australian agency to the international Pontifical Mission Societies. These Societies, locally and globally, attempt to answer the call to love God and neighbour. They work to establish the reign of God through building communities of missionary disciples of Jesus who share their faith by proclaiming the Word, serving those in need, acting for justice and creation, and adopting child-focused development programmes.

Catholic Mission operates in over 160 countries to support initiatives in 1100 dioceses, including remote Australia. Grassroots needs are identified by local Catholics, to give people the opportunity for a full, enriched life- physically and spiritually - regardless of race, religion or gender.

This year's appeal is inspired by the Gospel of John 'I have come so that they may have life and have it to the full' (Jn10:10).

Tell us, then, what you think. Is it lawful to pay taxes to the emperor, or not?" But Jesus, aware of their malice, said, "Why are you putting me to the test, you hypocrites? Show me the coin used for the tax." And they brought him a denarius. Then he said to them "Whose head is this, and whose title?" They answered, "The emperor's." Then he said to them, "Give therefore to the emperor the things that are the emperor's, and to God the things that are God's."
