## FIRST READING

### 1 Samuel 3:3-10, 19 (JB)

A reading from the first book of Samuel

**Speak, O Lord, your servant is listening.**

Samuel was lying in the sanctuary of the Lord where the ark of God was, when the Lord called, 'Samuel! Samuel!' He answered, 'Here I am.' Then he ran to Eli and said, 'Here I am, since you called me.' Eli said, 'I did not call. Go back and lie down.' So he went and lay down. Once again the Lord called, 'Samuel! Samuel!' Samuel got up and went to Eli and said, 'Here I am, since you called me.' He replied, 'I did not call you, my son; go back and lie down.' Samuel had as yet no knowledge of the Lord and the word of the Lord had not yet been revealed to him. Once again the Lord called, the third time. He got up and went to Eli and said, 'Here I am, since you called me.' A reading from the holy Gospel according to John

**They saw where Jesus lived and they stayed with him.**

As John stood with two of his disciples, Jesus passed, and John stared hard at him and said, 'Look, there is the lamb of God.' Hearing this, the two disciples followed Jesus. Jesus turned round, saw them following and said, 'What do you want?' They answered, 'Rabbi,'- which means Teacher - 'where do you live?' 'Come and see' he replied; so they went and saw where he lived, and stayed with him the rest of that day. It was about the tenth hour.

One of these two who became followers of Jesus after hearing what John had said was Andrew, the brother of Simon Peter. Early next morning, Andrew met his brother and said to him, 'We have found the Messiah' - which means the Christ - and he took Simon to Jesus. Jesus looked hard at him and said, 'You are Simon son of John; you are to be called Cephas' - meaning Rock.

**5.** We pray for children and teenagers during this holiday time that it may strengthen their family relationships, and following the example of Samuel, keep them alert to what God is saying to them in prayer.

**6.** We pray for all affected by the floods in the Eastern States, the bushfires on Western Australia and the earthquakes in Japan, that all may receive the help which they need.

We pray to the Lord. **Lord hear our prayer.**

**Celebrant.** Heavenly Father, with trust we declare to you that we have come to do your will, today and always, and ask for your grace to be faithful to this commitment. Through Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

Please *call* the Parish office if you would like to leave a message during this time and we will endeavor to get back to you.

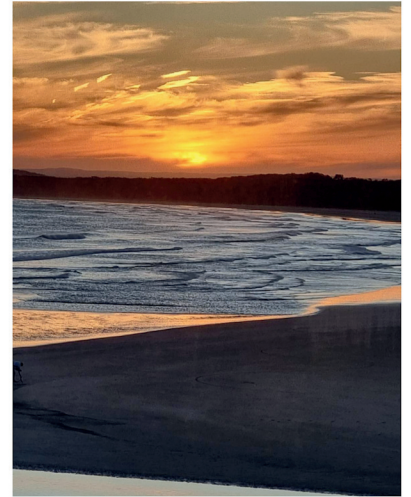
